
#### Investment risks

#### Fund Strategy

The fund holds a diversified portfolio of investment grade bonds with a small allocation to non-financial corporate high yield bonds. The largest allocation by sector remains financials with further notable holdings in non-financial hybrid bonds (bonds that have some equity like characteristics). To benefit from the additional yield available the fund also has an allocation to US dollar denominated bonds. The currency exposure from these bonds is hedged back to euros.


