## Summary of fund objective

The investment objective of the Fund is to seek long term capital appreciation, measured in Yen, through investment primarily in the equity securities of companies domiciled in or exercising the predominant part of their economic activity in Japan and which are listed on any exchanges or over the counter markets. The Fund will invest in companies who make advantageous use not only of their capital but also of their intangible assets (for example, but not limited to, brand values, technical development or strong customer base). The Fund may also invest, on an ancillary basis, in debt securities convertible into common shares and other equity linked instruments. 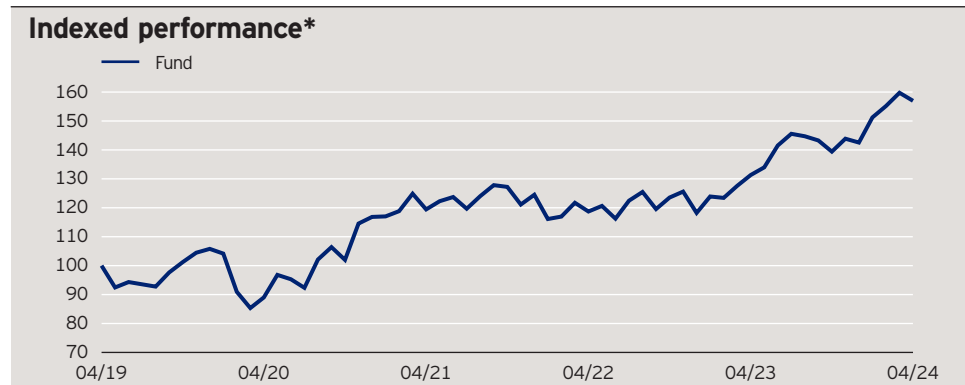

## Fund Strategy

The fund manager uses a bottom up research process to focus on high quality companies with sustainable competitive advantages, particularly those with strong intangible values which generate healthy cash flows. Specifically, the team believes that companies with, including but not limited to, strong brands, technology and customer loyalty can offer compelling long-term investment returns when purchased at attractive prices. These values embedded within a robust business franchise are difficult to create or replicate, and allow companies to sustain a competitive advantage. The effective use of intangibles can generate strong free cash flow and increase enterprise value.

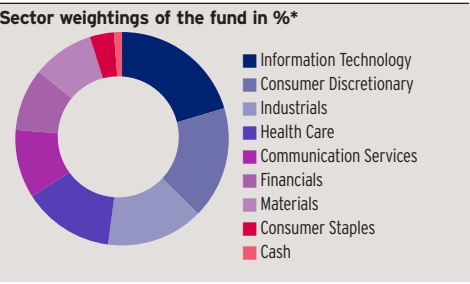
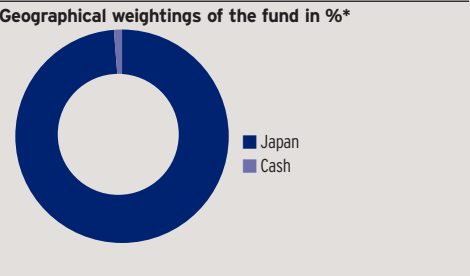

The Fund embeds an exclusionary framework to specific activities based on UN Global Compact, severe governmental sanctions, revenue thresholds for certain activities linked to environmental and/or social criteria, as well as ensuring that companies follow good governance practices. The list of activities and their thresholds are listed below.
