# **Executive summary**

- Narrowing credit spreads offset rising government bond yields.
- The ECB indicated interest rate cuts are coming but not imminent.
- Fund performed broadly in line with the EAA Fund EUR Cautious Allocation sector.

#### Market review

Bond markets faced headwinds from rising government bond yields as investors heeded warnings from the European Central Bank that while interest rate cuts are coming, they are not imminent. However, with inflationary pressures starting to abate - the annual growth of consumer prices in the eurozone eased to 2.4% in March, bringing it closer to the ECB's 2% target - bond markets staged a late rally on growing confidence that interest rates could be cut by June. According to the S&P composite purchasing managers' index, which measures business activity across the euro area, the economic outlook for the region is brightening with the PMI reading rising to a nine-month high of 49.9 (the 50 mark separates contraction from expansion).

It was a positive quarter for European corporate bond markets with high yield and investment grade registering gains. In terms of credit spreads, euro investment grade narrowed from 136bps to 113bps and euro high yield tightened from 396bps to 358bps.

Drawing support from resilient economic data, a decent earnings season and the prospect of lower interest rates, it was a healthy quarter for European equities with the MSCI Europe index returning 7.6% (net total returns). The best performing sectors were technology, consumer discretionary and financials.

#### Fund performance

The Invesco Pan European High Income Fund returned 1.78% over the quarter compared to a return of 1.82% for its peer group, the EAA Fund EUR Cautious Allocation sector. This placed the fund in the third quartile of the peer group. The fund's benchmark, 45% ICE BofA Euro High Yield Index (Total Return), 35% Bloomberg Pan European Aggregate Corp EUR Hedged Index (Total Return) & 20% MSCI Europe ex UK Index (Net Total Return), returned 2.53%.

Supported by a narrowing in spreads, credit was the biggest driver of performance with subordinated financials and high yield bonds contributing the most. There was also positive input from investment grade bonds, corporate hybrids and senior bank debt. Duration detracted from performance as the timing of the first expected rate cut from the European Central Bank was pushed back due to the lingering strength of inflation. The fund's allocation to equities delivered positive returns. The largest individual contributors were all equity holdings - Intesa Sanpaolo, SAP and Daimler Truck. The biggest detractors were EDP, Neste (both equities) and Codere (high yield bond).

The fund continues to be biased towards higher yielding parts of the bond market but avoiding companies that we think are likely to face significant challenges in dealing with rising borrowing costs and weakening economic activity. The largest allocation by industry within the bond portion remains financials. By industry the biggest non-financial exposures are to utilities, food and telecoms. The fund also has exposure to relatively defensive credits such as investment grade corporate bonds.



To broaden the opportunities for income and increase the opportunities for capital return, the fund holds an allocation of 19% in European equities. The focus here is on high-quality companies with strong balance sheets, healthy free cash flow generation and good management teams that are committed to and capable of returning that cash flow to shareholders where appropriate.

Modified duration was kept steady at 2.6 during the period.

### **Outlook**

The US federal funds rate is now in a target of 5.25% to 5.50%, its highest level in more than 20 years. In the eurozone, interest rates currently stand at a record-high of 4%. This highlights how far central banks have moved interest rates since the start of 2022. While the tightening effect has helped to calm inflation, it is important to shift focus towards the broader negative impact that higher borrowing costs have on economies. For us, this is particularly relevant to the weaker parts of the high yield bond market. While we continue to enjoy the higher income that today's yields offer, our more cautious outlook for the European economy and for high yield bond markets remains unchanged.
